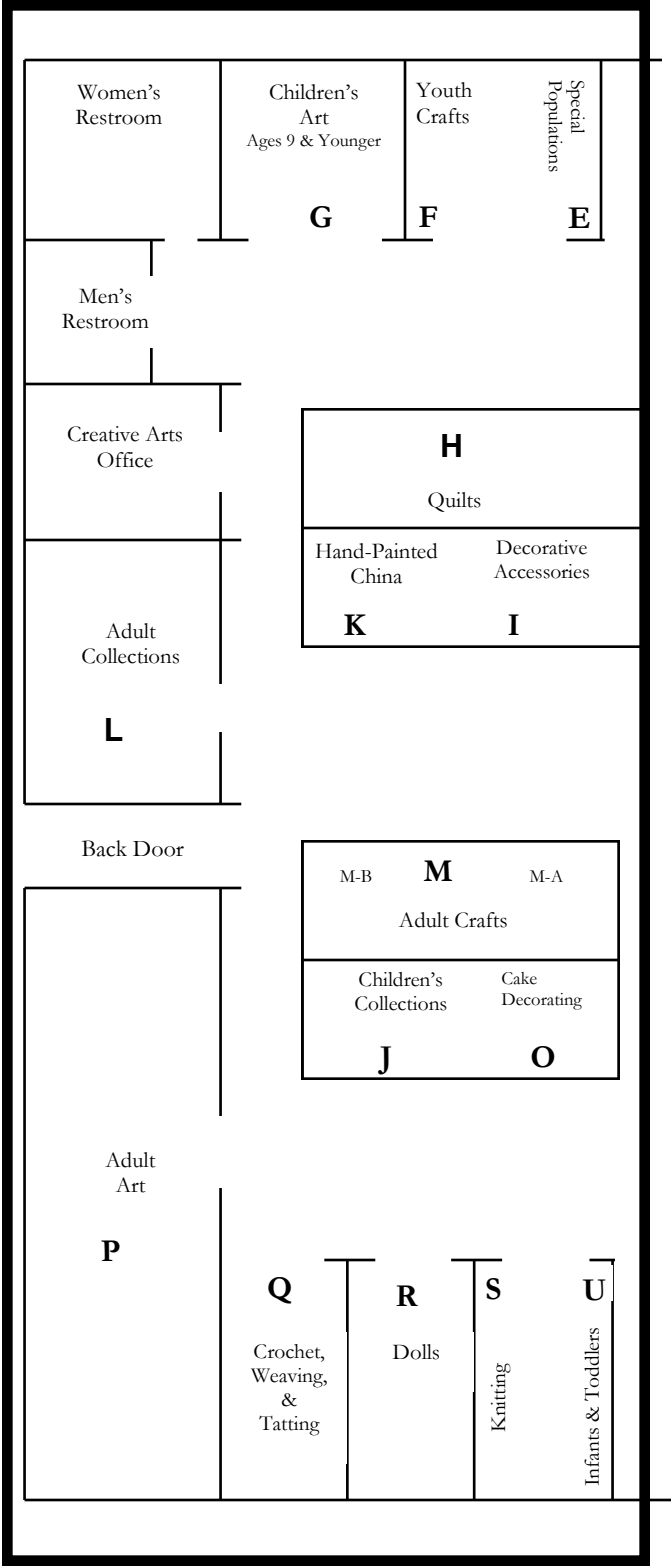

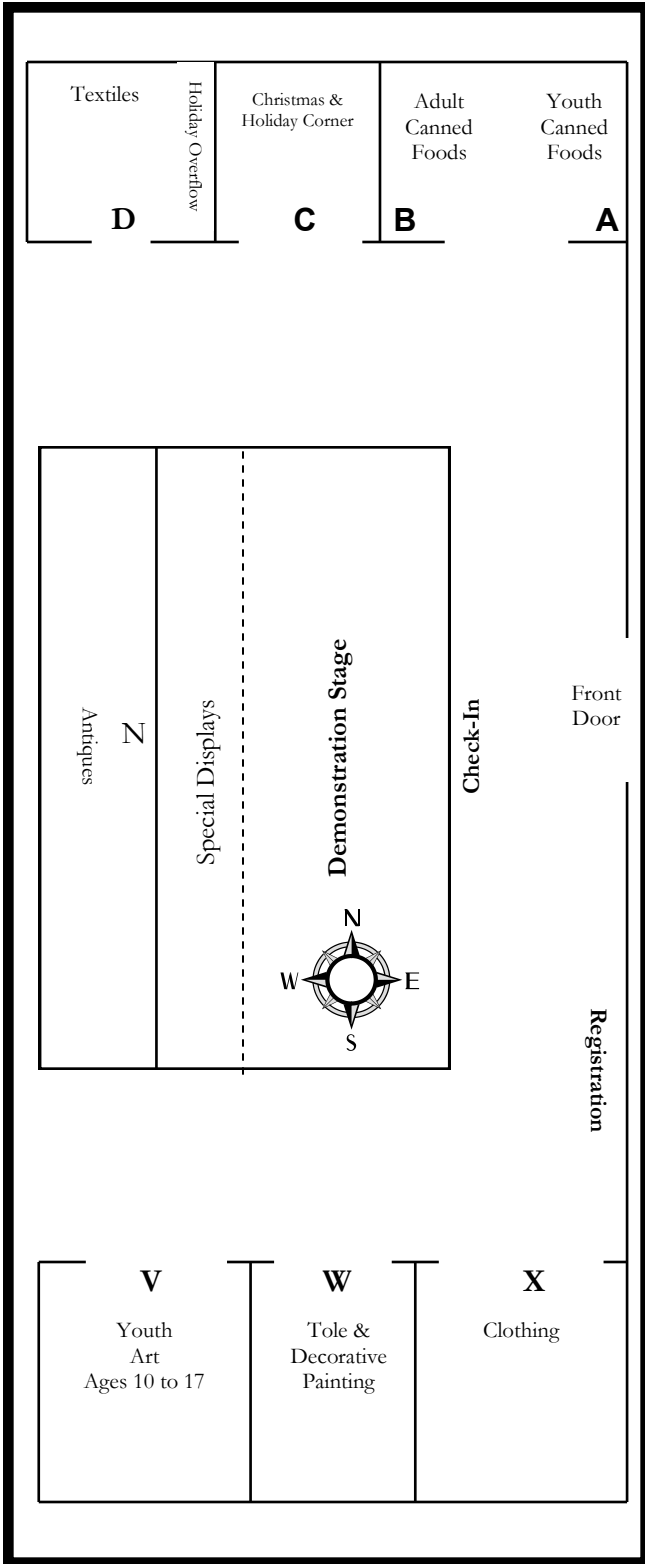

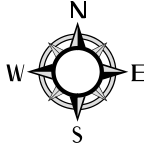

All entries in the Department will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations of the East Texas State Fair.

1. Every care will be taken of articles exhibited, but ETSF will not be responsible for properties entered.
2. **No items** will be accepted for display or competition that are distasteful, suggestive, offensive or controversial.
3. All pieces for exhibit must be brought to the Creative Arts Building (Building A) on the designated days. Entries will NOT be accepted by mail or other delivery or early.
4. All articles except antiques and hobbies entered in competition in this department must have been made within the last two years, and **can only be exhibited in the name of the individual making the item.**
5. Youth Safety: The expectation is that crafts which would require the use of tools or equipment typically unsafe for use by youth will be used under the supervision of an adult, but the primary work in creating the item will be that of the youth involved.
6. See Page 6 for Canned Foods Guidelines.
7. Any articles that have previously been exhibited for competition during any East Texas State Fair will not be accepted. Items that have taken premiums in a previous East Texas State Fair may be displayed if space permits.
8. Each exhibitor is permitted only one entry in each class.
9. Exhibitors must can their own products and do their own sewing and home improvement work for exhibit.
10. Exhibitors entering articles in Youth Divisions or Sections must be 17 years of age or younger.
11. Teachers and professionals may give a business card to Division Coordinator to place by exhibit after judging.
12. Judges must not award a premium to any unworthy exhibit, regardless of the number of entries in a class. When fewer than 3 entries are entered in a class, ribbons will be awarded at the discretion of the judges.

13. A fair and impartial arrangement of pictures and articles for advantageous showing will be made as conditions permit. Due to limited space, all pictures must be **framed and wired** for hanging. Wood frames are preferred. No **Saw tooth hangers**.
14. A specimen must be an article entirely finished.
15. All home improvement articles, such as quilts, rugs, etc., and all clothing must be clean. No article will be accepted that is soiled, shows wear or is unfit for exhibition. All articles must have been made in the last two years by the exhibitor.
16. All exhibitors in this department are prohibited from removing their entries from the exhibit place. All exhibits must remain in place until 2:00 p.m. on Sunday, October 2, and must be checked out by 4:00 p.m.
17. Entries can be obtained only by presentation of claim check to Creative Arts Coordinators on Sunday, October 2, between 2:00 and 4:00 p.m. or in the ETSF Office during the week following the Fair according to the schedule outlined on page 3.

All exhibit items not claimed by October 6, 2011, will be disposed of at the discretion of the East Texas State Fair.

PREMIUMS

Youth and Special Populations Premiums

For all **youth** classes, the following premiums will be paid:

1st Place - \$3.00 2nd Place - \$2.00 3rd Place - \$1.00
 Section TriColor - \$5.00 to replace 1st Place

Adult Premiums

(Does NOT include Special Populations)

Section TriColors - \$20.00 Premier Exhibitors - \$25.00

NO premiums will be paid for 1st Place, 2nd Place, or 3rd Place awards in individual adult classes.

4 Premier Exhibitors are selected based on accumulated points in certain adult divisions and/or classes as listed below. Teachers and professionals are NOT eligible for Premier Exhibitor honors.

Culinary Arts: Divisions B and O

Crafts & Hobbies: Divisions L, M, and N; some classes in Divisions C and I

Fine Arts: Divisions K, P, R, and W

Needle Arts: Divisions D, H, Q, S, U, W, and some classes in Divisions C and I

For **Premier Exhibitor** points will be accumulated as follows:

1st Place = 4 points
 2nd Place = 3 points
 3rd Place = 2 points
 Honorable Mention = 1 point.



Creative Arts Demonstrations

Individuals are invited to demonstrate craft skills and techniques during one or more of the scheduled demonstration times during the Fair. Contact the Fair office to present a demonstration.

Demonstration schedule will be posted in Building A during the Fair.



Guidelines for Canned Food

1. Canned items will be in standard glass containers, such as Mason, Ball, and Kerr jars.
2. Canned items accepted must have been canned October 2009 or later **by the exhibitor**.
3. There will be only one (1) jar per exhibitor in each class.
4. Vegetables, Fruits, Juices, Meats, and Sauces may be canned in quarts and pints.
5. Jams, Jellies, Pickles, Relishes, and Butters may be canned in quarts, pints, 1/2 pints, or jelly jars.
6. There must be no rusted lids.
7. All "screw rings" (rims) must be removed before entering.
8. All vegetables and fruits entered must be **below** the liquid and **1/2 inch from the top of the jar**.
9. All jars must be clean on the outside.
10. Jars with popped lids or open lids will not be accepted. All lids must be sealed closed.
11. No warm jars will be accepted.
12. Each jar entered must contain a label with the following information:

Name of the Food
Method of Food Preservation
Date Preserved

Examples:

° Peaches, hot pack, boiling water canner, 20 minutes. July 13, 2003.

° Spaghetti sauce, hot pack, pressure canner, 11 pounds pressure, 45 minutes. July 14, 2003.

13. No personal names will be allowed on the jars.
